<u>Instructions for Prostate Biopsy and Transrectal Ultrasound of the prostate</u>

If you have had an elevated PSA level, which is determined by blood work, or an enlarged prostate, then your doctor has requested that you have a prostate ultrasound and biopsy done.

- 1. One week before: NO ASPIRIN OR ANTI INFLAMMATORY MEDICATIONS, one week before your appointment. This includes: Aleve, Naproxen, Naprosyn, Motrin, Meloxicam, and Miroxicam, Ibuprofen, Celebrex, Plavix, and Coumadin. Also any vitamins or herbal supplements which would include fish oil or omega 3 fatty acids, (to include Lovaza), will need to be stopped at that time.
- 2. Begin the day before instructions with your antibiotics, as directed.
- 3. The day of the test: You will need to administer a disposable fleet's enema, two hours prior to you leaving your home for your test. The enema may be purchased at any drug store.
- 4. After your test:
 - a. Plan to return home and rest the day of the procedure.
 - b. You may notice some rectal bleeding or blood in your urine for a few days. This is normal.
 - c. You may notice blood in your semen for a few weeks after the procedure. This is normal.
 - d. You may resume sexual activity and exercise in a few days.
 - e. Call the office if you experience:
 - -Fever over 100.4
 - -Excessive bleeding (urine or rectal)
 - -Difficulty urinating
